Sri Sathya Sai Seva Organisations— an introduction



The Sri Sathya Sai Seva Organisations, founded by Bhagawan Sri Sathya Sai Baba in the year 1965, is a service organisation with a spiritual core and base to benefit all mankind irrespective of religion, caste, creed or sect. The Organisation serves as a platform for its members to undertake service and other activities motivated by an urge for one's own transformation with the aim of realising one's inherent divinity.

Without any distinction of religion, nationality, race, socio-economic status, either for those who work in the Organisation or for those who are served by it, the Organisation transcends all barriers leading humanity towards the ideal of 'Fatherhood of God and Brotherhood of Man'.

The concept of fees or membership subscription is alien to the Sri Sathya Sai Seva Organisations, for there cannot be any fee or subscription for one's journey towards his own self.

The organisation functions through its primary units called as Samithis and Bhajan Mandalis of which individuals - from different strata of society, different ethnic groups pursuing different religions and faiths - are members bound by the dictum of "Love all, Serve All" and pursue their own sadhana towards self-transformation following the path of selfless service to humanity.

At no point is an individual asked to follow a certain religion or rituals. On the contrary each is inspired to follow his own faith so as to ensure that a Hindu becomes a better Hindu, a Muslim becomes a better Muslim, a Christian becomes a better Christian and so on. In fact, this spiritual basis inspires everyone to pursue his own religion better by putting into practice Love and

"The Organisations named after Me are not to be used for publicising My Name, or creating a new cult around My worship... They must render seva (service) to the helpless, the sick, the distressed, the illiterate and the needy. Their seva (selfless service) should not be exhibitionistic; it must seek no reward, not even gratitude or thanks from the recipients. Seva is sadhana (spiritual exercise), not a pastime of the rich and well placed.

You must have the firm belief that the aim of this Organisation is to remove the obstacles that keep man away from God, that separate maanavathwa (Humanity) from Maadhavathwa (Divinity).. This Organisation must elevate the human into the

WINGS OF THE ORGANISATIONS

The Sri Sathya Sai Seva Organisation functions under three wings viz. (i) Spiritual, (ii) Education and (iii) Service.

Each activity in a wing is directed to facilitate and help the member in his own spiritual advancement. Although, the nature of activities undertaken under different wings appear to be distinct and dissimilar, but there is an inherent interrelationship amongst all the three wings. The three wings stand for Worship, Wisdom and Work.

Spirituality and Service are supplementary and complementary to each other. Spirituality is the motivational force behind service and service is the fulfillment of spirituality. Therefore, spiritual concepts learnt through education must be put into practice in form of service to humanity. Thus, in order to successfully realise the objective of joining the Sai Organisation, one must participate in activities of all the three wings.

ADMINISTRATION OF THE ORGANISATION

Headed by an All India President who is supported by the National Vice Presidents and State Presidents, the Organisation functions like a well-oiled machine in the District under the stewardship of the District President, focused on its purpose, clear in its vision and dedicated in its efforts to live up the Swami's message – "Love All, Serve All".

The Samithis and the Bhajan Mandalis constitute a genuine spiritual movement where the members are united by a common bond – Love for God and Service to fellow human beings.

The members of the organisation work as one cohesive unit, whether as sevadals providing service at Prashanthi Nilayam, at medical camps, doing Narayan seva or the bal-vikas gurus who work with young children to inspire in them a desire to inculcate the five human values of Truth, Righteousness, Love, Peace and Non-violence, or the teachers who having undergone the training in EHV help in guiding the young minds towards the higher goals of life or the Sai Youth who work tirelessly in the Sri Sathya Sai Village Integrated Programme and Sri Sathya Sai Vidya Jyoti

Programme- each of them are bound by one goal - "Service to Man is Service to God".

THE 9 POINT CODE OF CONDUCT AND 10 PRINCIPLES

Every member of the Organisation is expected to undertake Sadhana (spiritual discipline) as an integral part of his/her daily life by abiding by the following Nine Point Code of Conduct which has been bestowed by Baba for one's spiritual and personal development. In addition, the ten principles that forms the core of guidance for all the members of the Organisations ordained by Baba himself are also produced hereunder. The nine point code of conduct and the ten principles are fundamental to the spiritual development of the members of the Sai Organisations.

9 Point Code of Conduct

- ❖ Daily meditation and prayer.
- ❖ Devotional singing/prayer with members of one's family once a week.
- ❖ Participation in Bal Vikas programme by children of the family conducted by the Organisation.
- ❖ Attendance at least once a month at Bhajan or Nagar Sankeertan programme conducted by the Organisation.
- ❖ Participation in community service and other programmes of the Organisation.
- ❖ Regular study of Sai literature.
- ❖ Speak softly and lovingly with everyone with whom he comes into contact.
- ❖ Not to indulge in talking ill of others especially in their absence.
- ❖ Putting into practice the principle of "Ceiling on Desires" and utilise any savings thereby generated for the service of the mankind.

10 Guiding Principles

- ❖ Treat as sacred the land in which you were born. Have patriotism to your nation - but do not criticise other nations or put others down. Not even in your thoughts or dreams should you think of bringing grief to your country.
- ❖ Respect all religions equally.
- ❖ Recognise humanity as one family - treat everyone as a family member - love all
- ❖ Keep your house and surroundings clean - for this will promote hygiene and health.
- ❖ Practice charity - but do not encourage beggars by giving money. Provide food, clothing, shelter and help them on other ways (do not encourage laziness)
- ❖ Never give a bribe or take bribe - never give in to corruption.
- ❖ Curb envy and jealousy; expand your vision and outlook, Treat all equally regardless of caste or creed.
- ❖ Be self-reliant. You may be wealthy and have servants to do your bidding, but service to security must be done by yourself.
- ❖ Have and cultivate 'Love for God and fear of sin'.
- ❖ Never go against the laws of the land; follow these diligently both in word and in spirit. Be an exemplary citizen.

BRIEF HISTORY

History of SAI Movement in the Dist

The Rourkela Samithi of Sundargarh Dist came into being prior to 1970's. It was originally constituted by some devoted brothers and sisters. The Bhajan and Narayan Seva programme were started in the residence of brother late Maheswar Barik, Sector-18. In obedience to the directives of the State Organisation, Sri Barik was working as Chairperson of the Bhajan Center. Later on the Bhajan Center was shifted to the residence of Sri Nila Madhab Nayak. In subservience to the Divine direction of Lord Sri Sathya Sai, primarily the programmes like 'Narayan Seva' and 'Bal Vikash' got emerged. Thus the programme continued for some more time and afterwards, the Bhajan Centre was operated in the house of Sri Banabasi Patanaik. Thereafter the Bhajan Center is upgraded to Samithi under the patronage of Sri Jatadhari Pradhan in his residence (formerly REC and presently NIT Campus) and Sri Sathya Sai Seva Samithi, Rourkela was recognized vide its Regd. No. 03/1971.

In the beginning of 1980, Bhajan and other programmes were organized in the Hanuman Temple near Ganju Petrol Pump, Bisra Road under the able Chairmanship of Late Harekrishna Mishra, Advocate. At that time, all the programmes were organised under the dynamic leadership of Sri P. K. Murthy. By his dedicated effort the strength of devotees increased day by day. Thereafter Sri K. C. Pattanaik became the Secretary of the Samithi, who also added his effort for the growth of the Samithi. After his regime, Sri Ananda Acharya became the Secretary of the Rourkeala Samithi. Thereafter the Secretary post was abolished and replaced by Convener as per the directives of State Organisation. Late Pitabash Mishra became the first Convener of the Samithi and became the Dist. Sevadal Coordinator, Sundargarh. With this his task is further increased and discharged the function of State Sevadal Coordinator, Odisha. Under his dynamic and able leadership, not only the Dist Organisation but the State organization functioned well. He held the office of Sate Sevadal Coordinator till he left heavenly abode in the year 2012.

The Samithi thereafter started functioning in the residence of Sri P. L. Murthy, M-46, Basanti Colony till the new building is inaugurated. The permanent Prayer Hall of the Samithi at Oram Para, Udit Nagar, Rourkela-12 was constructed and inaugurated in the year 1992 on the 'Kumar Purnima' occasion. Sri P.C. Mishra became the Convener thereafter and spread the message of the Swamy to a large extent. After him the following persons discharged the duty as Convener :

1. Sri M. N. P. Singh (Afterwards became the Dist. President, Sundargarh), Sri P. M. K. Patra, Sri K. K. Pattanaik, Sri Trilochan Rout and Sri Kamal Lochan Pradhan (present Convener)

Smt. Manjula Sahu initially held the responsibility of Samithi Education Coordinator, thereafter became the Dist Education Coordinator and presently discharging her duty as State Sevadal Coordinator (Ladies). She had contributed a lot to Bal Vikash during her regime.

SRI SATYA SAI SEVA SAMITI, SUNDERGARH : First of all, Bhajan started informally in the residence of Sri Sahu, Head clerk of Excise department. Sri B. S Prakash was also attending the Bhajan. But after two to three months, Sri Sahu was transferred. So the Bhajan centre was shifted to the residence of Sri B. S Prakash, Near Old Cinema Hall, Rangadhipa, Sundargarh. By that time Sri Bansidhar Mohapatra, Tahasildar came to Sundergarh, who had a greater role in taking the Samithi ahead. Balvikash Class was started at the quarter of Sri Bansidhar Mohapatra by his brother-in-law in the year 1974 and which too shifted to the house of Sri B. S Prakash by the end of 1974. Sister B. Bijayalaxmi and Br. Lingaraj Rath were the first Bal vikash Gurus of the centre. Thereafter another bhajan centre emerged at the residence of Sri Sribachha Mishra, Patrapara, Sundargarh. Bhajan, Nagarsankirtan and Bal Vikas started at both the centres. By the time Sri Baidyanath Mishra transferred to SBI, Sundergarh from SBI, Kamakshyanagar, who too was a devotee of Bhagawan, suggested to convert Bhajan Centre to Samithi as devotees were increasing substantially.

Sri Baidyanath Mishra, Sri Sribachha Mishra, Sri Govindra Chandra Rath and Sri B. S Prakash proceeded to Prashnati Nilayam in November 1975 to attend the First World Conference. They contacted Sri Brahmanand Panda, the then State President and requested to upgrade the Bhajan Centre to Samithi with proper evidences. Before the birthday of Swamy i.e on 22nd November 1975, our revered the then State President, Sri Brahmananda Panda managed to get the permission directly from Bhagwan Baba. Overwhelmed with joy they immediately telegraphed the message to Sundergarh. Every one delighted with joy. The house of Sri B. S Prakash fell short due to increase of devotees. All devotees thought of to have a temple to install Swamy. Unitedly they met Sri Prasad Sekhardeo and also father of Sri Satyanaryan Bakshi, a dedicated devotee of Swami, to motivate the king of Sundargarh to gift a plot for construction of Satya Sai Mandir. Sri Bansidhar Mohapatra, the then Tahasildar also joined the group to His Highness. It was all Bhagawan's master-plan & design. A plot of Ac 0.37 dec. was registered in the name of Sri Satya Sai Seva Organisation on dt. 18th June 1976. The plot had already a well and a building having two small rooms. Sevadals with high spirit demarcated the plot by planting with '**Pink Morning Glory**' plants. The Samithi was running at the residence of Sri B. S Prakash. The building with two rooms was upgraded to a Prayer Hall and Bhagwan was shifted on **5th September 1977** on the occasion of Sri Krishna Janmashthami after doing Pratistha Puja ceremoniously. Sri Lingaraj Rath was given with the charge for protection of the area as well as daily Puja. Many development works were undertaken thereafter. Simultaneously a school building is constructed towards the south side of the prayer hall as the existing premise of prayer hall was quite insufficient. The expenditure upto the plinth level was borne by Late Sri Bansidhar Buxi (2) the then first President. An urgent meeting was called on to construct a new large prayer hall and all were requested to contribute to their might. The then Dist. President, Sri Bansidhar Buxi (2) breathed his last on 1st January 1977. Out of immense love and devotion to Bhagwan, a group of around 50 devotees started for Puttaparthi in October 1976 by hiring a bus to witness Dussehra Festival under the leadership of Sri Baidyanath Mishra, Sri B. S Prakash and Sri Lingaraj Rath.

Sri Padmanava Bohidar was the first Chairman of Sri Satya Sai Seva Samiti, Sundergarh. Sri Basanta Kumar Tripathy joined as Executive Engineer, PWD, Sundargarh. Sri Govindra

Chandra Rath also joined as Sr. Accountant of R.O Division, Sundergarh . They played a major role in constructing the school building as well as new prayer hall. Smt Swarnalata Buxi, wife of Late Bansidhar Buxi came forward to look after the unfinished work of her late husband. She shared a major contribution in both. The Prayer Hall was named after her husband i.e “Bansidhar Prayer Hall”. The first state level Summer Course Camp was organized at Sundergarh in the unfinished building in the year 1991, where the then Vice President Prof. Sri I. S. Rao and Sri Sachhidananda Nanda were the guests as well as resource persons. By then new “Library Hall” and “Open Stage” were inaugurated by Prof. Sri I.S. Rao, the then State Vice -President. Sri Divyalochan Sekhar Deo, the then Minister of Irrigation, Odisha was the next Dist. President. Many Bhajan Mandalis Viz: Rupidihi, Gargadbahal, Majhapara, Tudalaga, Telendihi, Gariazore, Panchpara and many others were emerged. During his tenure, **9th State Conference** was held at Sundergrah in January 1980. After coming from the 3rd Conference, Bhajan Mandalis such as Mundapara, Laldhipa and Bhajan centres opened at Kiakachhar, Ratanpur, Balijori and Kirei. Besides that, family Bhajans grown-up in the town substantially. Baunshpada village was adopted and was covered under SSSVIP Project. More than 5 cares were taken. Now Vidyajyoti Project is undertaken here. One Swami’s temple was constructed at Laldhipa by the devotees/villagers under the direct supervision of Br. Sudhakar Sahu the then convener of the Samithi. The temple was constructed by the villagers by their own Seva. Village integrated programs started from the year 2002 to celebrate the 77th birthday of Bhagwan by giving 77 hours for villages. This program continued for 12 years. Seva, Bhajan, Blood Donation, Health Check Up, Amruta Kalash Distribution, Cleaning, Satsang etc. were among the programs. Many villages (around 10-12) were covered per year to spread Swamy’s Messages. With these activities many devotees came from the villages and thus a Sai movement taken in and around the town.

Second State Conference was organized at Sundergarh in January 2009. Br. Sri Lingaraj Rath was nominated as Dist. President by the then State President Sri Harikrishna Dash on October 2010. During his tenure, the Garva Gruha of Sundergarh Sai Temple in memory of his father Late Raghunath Rath was constructed. One Hall named after Sai-Geeta came up during 2015. The hall was constructed by Br. Diganta Naik in the memory of his father and mother.

Sundergarh Samiti has created a space in the heart of Bhagwan Baba by its quality of Bhajan, Bal Vikas and Seva Activities. It stood first as the Best Bhajan Centre in the year 2015 in the state. State level festival of joy was organized at Sundergarh Samiti in the year 2017. Also Zonal level women convention was organized in Rupidihi Bhajan Mandali in the year 2017. Samithi has adopted Shivasankar Orphanage, Belsara since 1988. BV Class is going on every Monday and functions on festival days are being observed with inmates. Sundargarh Samithi has also been conducting Bal Vikash and Seva activities off and on in rural as well as urban areas. The children of Belsara Anathasram are being taken to Puri phase by phase to visit Lord Jagannath & Sea. A group of 25 BV children of the orphanage were also taken to Prashanti Nilayam in the year 2018 during “Parthi Yatra“. They were interviewed by Radio Sai. State has contributed Ceiling Fans at the Belsara orphanage in presence of the then State President, Sri Harikrishna Dash, Late Parshuram Sahu and Sri Antaryami Pattnaik. The Rupidhi Bhajan Mandali has adopted Old-age Home, Ravandihi, Sundargarh. They are, particularly Mahila Vibhag taking up Seva activities there regularly. They are doing yeomen’s Service. We are marching slowly but steadily to make Sundergarh, Sai-maya by the end of year 2025, the year, Swamy’s 100 years of Avataratwa in this earth.

SRI SATYA SAI SEVA SAMITI, RAJGANGPUR

1 : In 1973 Br. Late MSN Murty and family put foundation of Bhajan Center in his residential quarter, Block-8, OCL Colony, Rajgangpur. He started Swamy's Bhajan, Nagarsankirtan and Narayanseva, day to day Puja and after 2/3 years all activities shifted to the qtr no 5/91, OCL colony due to much crowd of the devotees in the small quarter of Br. MSN Murty.

2 : All day to day activities continued accordingly in qtr of Br Late Dayanidhi Prasad. This practice continued there with a good response upto one year and all devotes started praying Swamy to bless for a temple so that all can take various activities other than normal functions. By the infinite love & grace of Swamy they could be able to possess a piece of land of 19 decimal at Liploi, Rajgangpur. By the help of OCL, Rajgangpur and offering own labour of devotees, the temple construction started and completed in 1975. The temple is inaugurated and named as "**SAI NILAYAM**".

3 : In 1975 Rajgangpur is recognized as a Samithi by the State Office with its registration no - **29**. As per formalities they applied for lease of the said land on 27th Jan 1999 and accordingly a lease is granted by the Asst Settlement Officer, Sundargarh vide Plot no 542 and 541/769 under khata no. 127 of Village Liploi, Rajgangpur on 19-02-1999.

4 : The Samithi activities thereafter took a good shape and run smoothly. Brothers Late Srinibas Joshi, Rajgangpur, and Br Late Baladev Mohanty selected as Secreteray as Chairman & Secretary respectively of the Samithi. During that period the devotees' strength of the Samithi was quite good. Some prominent devotees along with family such as SjtJaihari Dalmia, Smt. Kavita Dalmia, Br. Dutta Choudhry and Br. A. N. Ray, Br. P. C. Pattanayak, Br. Natha, Br. MSN Murty, Br. Baladev Mohanty, Br. Daya Nidhi Prasad, Br. Raghunath Mohanty, Br. Batakrushna Mohanty, Br. Goura Gopal Das, Br. Sadashiv Deo, Br. S.P. Pattanayak, Br. Jagannath Satpaqthy, Br. P. C. Sah, Br. S. C. Ray, Br. Biswal, Br. D. Nayak & others extended full support and best cooperation in executing programmes and brotherly love all activities, functions were celebrated in the Samithi,

ACTIVITIES


